While students' Home Learning Timetables serve the purpose of organising their time to do what they have to do, they also need to learn how they are going to organise that time to complete these tasks. Learning how to plan and set timelines is the growth mindset they need to overcome such challenges.

Students need to set timelines for tasks such as:

- completing unfinished learning from the school day.
- practising further subject material to reinforce and consolidate the concepts in their minds.
- connecting with and applying new knowledge learned to new situations.
- revising what they have learnt in order to store it in their long-term memory to retrieve later
- reviewing notes from class in a structured manner; timelines are a must here.
- going off on tangents which interest them and investigating new possibilities to explore and experiment with.
- reading, researching, evaluating, reflecting, thinking and imagining.

Being able to plan and set timelines to accomplish what they set out to do broadens and engages their attention by connecting them with themselves and the moment and reduces anxious feelings.
