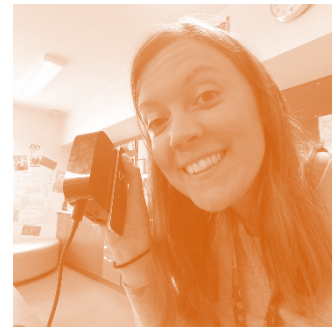

PREP SCULPTURE SKILLS

What is a sculpture? Where and how do artists make sculptures?

In Term 4, students will explore sculpture through a series of activities focused on building awareness of form, space, texture and balance. They will be given opportunities to create 3D artworks both indoors and outdoors (using a range of materials and tools) and will practice collaborating with others - including sharing and combining their ideas.

Prep students will also contribute to our school's 'Flock Oz' collaborative art project by decorating a wooden migratory bird to be installed in our schoolyard for the local community to visit.

GRADE 1 PAPIER-MÂCHÉ SCULPTURES

What makes a strong sculpture?

In Term 4, students will plan, build, paint and photograph a 3D sculpture. They will learn to use effective joining techniques to create a strong base and frame for their sculpture and practice following the steps in a papier-mâché technique to create a strong outer shell for decorating.

Year 1 students will also contribute to our school's 'Flock Oz' collaborative art project by decorating a wooden migratory bird to be installed in our schoolyard for the local community to visit.

GRADE 2 PAPIER-MÂCHÉ MASKS

Why do people make and use masks?

In Term 4, students will examine masks from different cultures around the world and discuss the many reasons why people make and use masks. They will make a plan for their own mask design, use a papier-mâché technique to add form and texture to a plain mask, decorate the mask surface using various materials and tools and finally photograph their artwork for exhibition.
